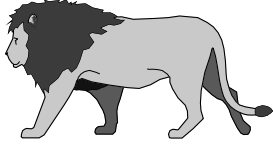


GRADE 5 GEOGRAPHY PROJECT



TASK:

You have been given a blank map of Southern Africa.
Use this map to produce a jigsaw puzzle which will promote tourism in the region.



Instructions

1. Mark all the provinces of South Africa.
2. Mark all the neighbouring countries.
3. Name the oceans.
4. Indicate the position and name of the capital city of each province.
5. Find and mark Cape Agulhas, the Orange River, the Limpopo River and Durban on your map.
6. Colour your map in NEATLY.
7. Select **AT LEAST** five places of interest eg. the Big Hole, and draw them in the correct positions on your map.
8. Paste your map onto a piece of cardboard.
9. Cut your map into a jigsaw puzzle – your puzzle should have at least 25 pieces.
10. Present your completed puzzle in a suitable box, envelope or other container which must be labelled with your name and grade.

PLEASE DO NOT WRITE ON YOUR MAP WITH A BLACK KOKI PEN – USE ONLY A BLACK FINELINER OR BALL POINT PEN.

Names of countries and provinces – CAPITAL LETTERS – eg **NAMIBIA**

Names of capital cities eg **Windhoek**

You will be marked on the following criteria:

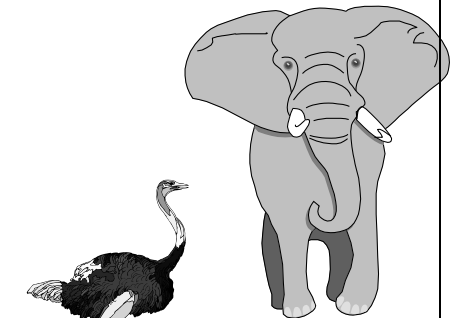
Presentation – neatly coloured in, correct pen used, names written correctly, suitable container, etc.

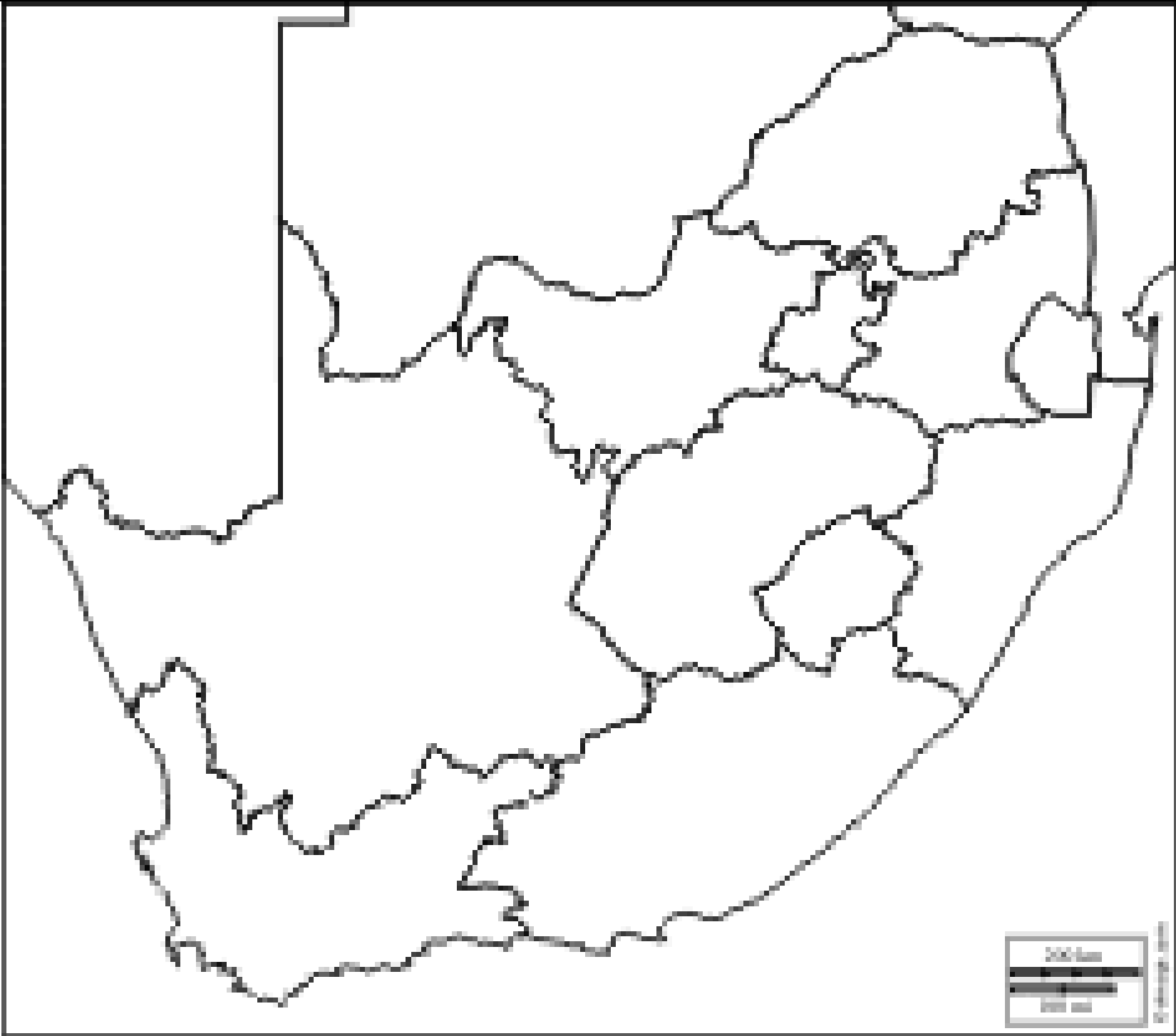
